#### **NC Pre-K Enrollment**

47% of Beaufort County eligible 4-year-olds are enrolled in NC Pre-K, below the rural nonmetro county average of 68%.



#### **Adult Learners**

22% of Beaufort County adults 25-44 have some college, no degree, above the rural nonmetro county average of 17%.



## **Postsecondary Completion**

52% of Beaufort County high school graduates who enroll in postsecondary earn a degree or credential within 6 years, below the rural non-metro county average of 55%.

## How students in Beaufort County traditional schools are currently doing:

To meet state goals, each year Beaufort County needs:

- 47% of eligible 4-year-olds enrolled in NC Pre-K program; 80 more needed to meet state goal of 75%. 2022
- 23% of 3-8 graders are earning college-and-career-ready scores (level 4 or 5) in reading; 1,345 more needed to meet state goal of 73%. 2022
- 30% of 3-8 graders are earning college-and-career-ready scores (level 4 or 5) in math; 1,516 more needed to meet state goal of 86%. 2022
- 86% of 9th graders graduate within four years; 43 more needed to meet state goal of 95%. 2021
- 24% of students are chronically absent from school; 743 less needed to meet state goal of 11%. 2021






