Top Opportunities for Growth

These three areas represent the biggest opportunities for Chowan County to improve future attainment outcomes.



Earning College Credit in High School

35% of Chowan County graduates participated in the Career & College Promise programs, below the rural non-metro county average of 49%. Also, <5% of high school students took at least one AP exam, below the peer county average of 7%.



School Counselors

Chowan County has a student-to-school counselor ratio of 362:1, above the rural nonmetro county average of 318:1.



Transition to Postsecondary

47% of Chowan County seniors enroll in postsecondary within 12 months of graduation, below the rural non-metro county average of 50%.

How students in Chowan County traditional schools are currently doing:

To meet state goals, each year Chowan County needs:

- Chowan County has met the goal for Pre-K enrollment. (Goal: 75%).
- 24% of 3-8 graders are earning college-and-career-ready scores (level 4) or 5) in reading; 409 more needed to meet state goal of 73%. 2022
- 32% of 3-8 graders are earning college-and-career-ready scores (level 4 or 5) in math; 452 more needed to meet state goal of 86%. 2022
- 90% of 9th graders graduate within four years; 7 more needed to meet state goal of 95%. 2021
- 15% of students are chronically absent from school; 78 less needed to meet state goal of 11%. 2021



Career and College Preparation

Students in Chowan County completed 133 Career & Technical Education concentrations in 2021. The top three CTE concentrations completed include Health Science; Human Services; and Manufacturing.




