Math Performance

14% of Edgecombe County 3-8 graders earn college-and-career-ready scores in Math, below the rural metro county average of 28%.



Reading Performance

Postsecondary Completion

45% of Edgecombe County high school graduates who enroll in postsecondary earn a degree or credential within 6 years, below the rural metro county average of 57%.

How students in Edgecombe County traditional schools are currently

To meet state goals, each year Edgecombe County needs:

- 60% of eligible 4-year-olds enrolled in NC Pre-K program; 63 more needed to meet state goal of 75%. 2022
- 13% of 3-8 graders are earning college-and-career-ready scores (level 4 or 5) in reading; 1,522 more needed to meet state goal of 73%. 2022
- 14% of 3-8 graders are earning college-and-career-ready scores (level 4 or 5) in math; 1,834 more needed to meet state goal of 86%. 2022
- 85% of 9th graders graduate within four years; 46 more needed to meet state goal of 95%. 2021
- 36% of students are chronically absent from school; 1,334 less needed to meet state goal of 11%. 2021




