19% of Granville County 3-8 graders earn college-and-career-ready scores in Math, below the rural metro county average of 28%.



#### **Reading Performance**

#### **First-Year Persistence**

68% of Granville County high school graduates who enroll in postsecondary persist to their second year, below the rural metro county average of 73%.

## How students in Granville County traditional schools are currently doing:

To meet state goals, each year Granville County needs:

- Granville County has met the goal for Pre-K enrollment. (Goal: 75%).
- 20% of 3-8 graders are earning college-and-career-ready scores (level 4) or 5) in reading; 1,585 more needed to meet state goal of 73%. 2022
- 19% of 3-8 graders are earning college-and-career-ready scores (level 4 or 5) in math; 1,999 more needed to meet state goal of 86%. 2022
- 84% of 9th graders graduate within four years; 66 more needed to meet state goal of 95%. 2021
- 32% of students are chronically absent from school; 1,437 less needed to meet state goal of 11%. 2021








