How students in Guilford County traditional schools are currently doing:

To meet state goals, each year Guilford County needs:

- 70% of eligible 4-year-olds enrolled in NC Pre-K program; 167 more needed to meet state goal of 75%. 2022
- 26% of 3-8 graders are earning college-and-career-ready scores (level 4) or 5) in reading; 14,168 more needed to meet state goal of 73%. 2022
- 28% of 3-8 graders are earning college-and-career-ready scores (level 4 or 5) in math; 17,734 more needed to meet state goal of 86%. 2022
- 91% of 9th graders graduate within four years; 212 more needed to meet state goal of 95%. 2021
- 27% of students are chronically absent from school; 10,388 less needed to meet state goal of 11%. 2021













