

### How students in Mecklenburg County traditional schools are currently

To meet state goals, each year Mecklenburg County needs:

- 30% of eligible 4-year-olds enrolled in NC Pre-K program; 2,696 more needed to meet state goal of 75%. 2022
- 28% of 3-8 graders are earning college-and-career-ready scores (level 4 or 5) in reading; 29,050 more needed to meet state goal of 73%. 2022
- 35% of 3-8 graders are earning college-and-career-ready scores (level 4 or 5) in math; 33,338 more needed to meet state goal of 86%. 2022
- 84% of 9th graders graduate within four years; 1,296 more needed to meet state goal of 95%. 2021
- 26% of students are chronically absent from school; 20,817 less needed to meet state goal of 11%. 2021




Mecklenburg County has a student-to-school counselor ratio of 244:1 versus 294:1 in peer counties. 2021

### **Career and College Preparation**



10,663 high school students took at least one AP course (25%) versus 25% in peer counties



1,626 graduates participated in Career & College Promise programs (17%) versus 17% in peer counties (2021).

Students in Mecklenburg County completed **4,164 Career & Technical Education** concentrations in 2021. The top three CTE concentrations completed include Hospitality & Tourism; Marketing; and Health Science.






