#### **Top Opportunities** for Growth

#### **NC Pre-K Enrollment**

53% of Mitchell County eligible 4-year-olds are enrolled in NC Pre-K, below the rural nonmetro county average of 68%.



#### **High School Graduation**

76% of Mitchell County 9th graders complete high school in 4 years or less, below the rural non-metro county average of 86%.



#### Adult Learners

23% of Mitchell County adults 25-44 have some college, no degree, above the rural nonmetro county average of 17%.

#### How students in Mitchell County traditional schools are currently doing:

To meet state goals, each year Mitchell County needs:

- 53% of eligible 4-year-olds enrolled in NC Pre-K program; 14 more needed to meet state goal of 75%. 2022
- 30% of 3-8 graders are earning college-and-career-ready scores (level 4) or 5) in reading; 335 more needed to meet state goal of 73%. 2022
- 27% of 3-8 graders are earning college-and-career-ready scores (level 4 or 5) in math; 454 more needed to meet state goal of 86%. 2022
- 76% of 9th graders graduate within four years; 30 more needed to meet state goal of 95%. 2021
- 25% of students are chronically absent from school; 247 less needed to meet state goal of 11%. 2021




Mitchell County has a student-to-school counselor ratio of 284:1 versus 318:1 in peer counties. 2021

#### **Career and College Preparation**



38 high school students took at least one AP course (7%) versus 7% in peer counties (2021).



107 graduates participated in **Career & College Promise** programs (85%) versus 49% in peer counties (2021).

Students in Mitchell County completed 120 Career & Technical Education concentrations in 2021. The top three CTE concentrations completed include Human Services; Health Science; and Science, Technology, Engineering, & Mathematics.


- 76% of graduates reported intentions to enroll in a postsecondary institution versus 69% in peer counties. 2021




