NC Pre-K Enrollment

41% of Rockingham County eligible 4-yearolds are enrolled in NC Pre-K, below the rural metro county average of 59%.



Chronic Absenteeism

37% of Rockingham County students are chronically absent from school, above the rural metro county average of 29%.



First-Year Persistence

69% of Rockingham County high school graduates who enroll in postsecondary persist to their second year, below the rural metro county average of 73%.

How students in Rockingham County traditional schools are currently

To meet state goals, each year Rockingham County needs:

- 41% of eligible 4-year-olds enrolled in NC Pre-K program; 201 more needed to meet state goal of 75%. 2022
- 23% of 3-8 graders are earning college-and-career-ready scores (level 4 or 5) in reading; 2,492 more needed to meet state goal of 73%. 2022
- 28% of 3-8 graders are earning college-and-career-ready scores (level 4 or 5) in math; 2,861 more needed to meet state goal of 86%. 2022
- 88% of 9th graders graduate within four years; 67 more needed to meet state goal of 95%. 2021
- 37% of students are chronically absent from school; 2,785 less needed to meet state goal of 11%. 2021



Career and College Preparation



299 high school students took at least one AP course (9%) versus 9% in peer counties (2021).



296 graduates participated in **Career & College Promise** programs (38%) versus 43% in peer counties (2021).

Students in Rockingham County completed 428 Career & Technical Education concentrations in 2021. The top three CTE concentrations completed include Health Science; Human Services; and Hospitality & Tourism.




