42% of Union County 3-8 graders earn college-and-career-ready scores in Reading, below the state goal of 73%.

How students in Union County traditional schools are currently doing:

To meet state goals, each year Union County needs:

- 47% of eligible 4-year-olds enrolled in NC Pre-K program; 222 more needed to meet state goal of 75%. 2022
- 42% of 3-8 graders are earning college-and-career-ready scores (level 4) or 5) in reading; 5,816 more needed to meet state goal of 73%. 2022
- 52% of 3-8 graders are earning college-and-career-ready scores (level 4 or 5) in math; 6,289 more needed to meet state goal of 86%. 2022
- 93% of 9th graders graduate within four years; 82 more needed to meet state goal of 95%. 2021
- 22% of students are chronically absent from school; 4,431 less needed to meet state goal of 11%. 2021



Career and College Preparation



2,923 high school students took at least one AP course (21%) versus 15% in peer counties (2021).



849 graduates participated in **Career & College Promise** programs (26%) versus 33% in peer counties (2021).

Students in Union County completed 1,386 Career & Technical Education concentrations in 2021. The top three CTE concentrations completed include Health Science; Hospitality & Tourism; and Agricultural, Food, & Natural Resources.






