How students in Yancey County traditional schools are currently doing:

To meet state goals, each year Yancey County needs:

- 45% of eligible 4-year-olds enrolled in NC Pre-K program; 30 more needed to meet state goal of 75%. 2022
- 35% of 3-8 graders are earning college-and-career-ready scores (level 4) or 5) in reading; 330 more needed to meet state goal of 73%. 2022
- 41% of 3-8 graders are earning college-and-career-ready scores (level 4 or 5) in math; 397 more needed to meet state goal of 86%. 2022
- 88% of 9th graders graduate within four years; 11 more needed to meet state goal of 95%. 2021
- 15% of students are chronically absent from school; 75 less needed to meet state goal of 11%. 2021



Career and College Preparation



45 high school students took at least one AP course (8%) versus 7% in peer counties (2021).



94 graduates participated in Career & College Promise programs (69%) versus 49% in peer counties (2021).

Students in Yancey County completed 113 Career & Technical Education concentrations in 2021. The top three CTE concentrations completed include Human Services; Architecture and Construction; and Health Science.






