harter schools are public schools that must be authorized by the NC State Board of Education to operate. Like traditional public schools, charter schools are primarily funded through state and local tax dollars and are prohibited from discriminating in admissions, having religious affiliations, or charging tuition. "Charter schools are held accountable through the State assessment and accountability system." Because charter schools have open enrollment and often serve students from multiple counties, charter school profiles are aggregated up to the Prosperity-Zone level. In North Carolina there are 206 charter schools and 115 traditional public school districts operating 2,484 schools.







ACADEMIC READINESS

How students in North Carolina charter schools are currently doing:

- 38% of 3-8 graders are earning college-and-career-ready scores (level 4 or 5) in reading; 24,962 more needed to meet state goal of 73%. 2023
- 37% of 3-8 graders are earning college-and-career-ready scores (level 4 or 5) in **math**; 34,434 more needed to meet state goal of **86**%. 2023
- 79% of 9th graders graduate within four years; 1,079 more needed to meet state goal of 95%. 2023
- 21% of students are chronically absent from school; 13,979 less needed to meet state goal of 11%. 2023

Access to Postsecondary Credits

Students in North Carolina completed **420 Career & Technical Education (CTE) credentials (118 (28%) were industry-valued credentials) and 379 concentrations** in 2023. The top three CTE concentrations completed include Arts, Audio/Video Technology, & Communications; Science, Technology, Engineering, & Mathematics; and Architecture and Construction.



5,459 high school students took at least one **AP test (27%)** (2023).




2,117 high school students participated in Career & College Promise programs (43%) (2023).

COLLEGE & CAREER ACCESS

How students in North Carolina charter schools are planning for and enrolling in college:

- 67% of seniors completed the FAFSA in 2022; 693 more need to complete in 2022 to meet state goal of **80**%. 2023
- 82% of graduates reported **intentions to enroll** in a postsecondary institution.
- 69% of graduates enrolled in a postsecondary institution within 12 months. 2022



POSTSECONDARY COMPLETION

- 71% of students who enroll earn a degree or certificate within 6 years. 2022



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
