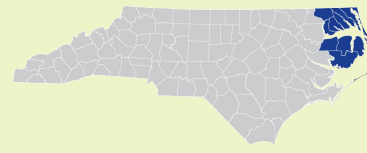

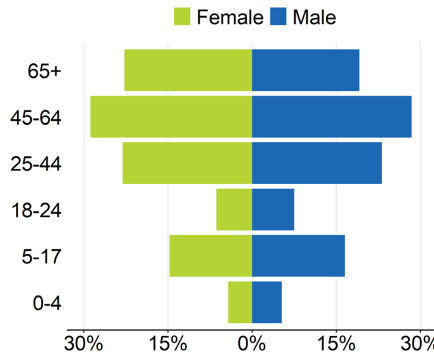

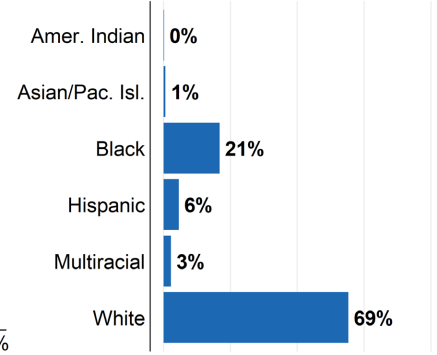

Race/Ethnicity, 2022




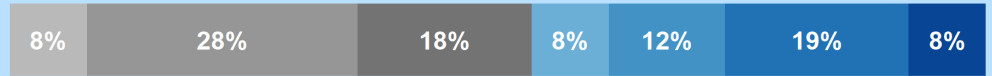

Success of Albemarle Commission High School Graduates

- **79%** of students who enroll **persist to their second year** versus **83%** for the state. 2022
- **59%** of students who enroll **earn a degree or certificate** within 6 years versus **59%** for the state. 2022

- **4,057** of all college-goers attended **College of The Albemarle**
- **661** of all college-goers attended **Beaufort County CC**
- **297** of all college-goers attended **Pitt CC**

- **61%** of seniors **completed the FAFSA** in 2023, compared to **62%** statewide; 282 more need to complete in 2023 to meet state goal of **80%**. 2023
- **73%** of graduates reported **intentions to enroll** in a postsecondary institution versus **74%** in the state. 2022
- **52%** of graduates **enrolled in a postsecondary institution** within 12 months versus **58%** in the state. 2022

How students in Albemarle Commission traditional schools are currently doing:

To meet state goals, each year Albemarle Commission needs:

- Albemarle Commission has met the goal for **Pre-K enrollment**. (Goal: **75%**). 2023
- **29%** of 3-8 graders are earning college-and-career-ready scores (level 4 or 5) in **reading**, compared to **30%** statewide; 4,518 more needed to meet state goal of **73%**. 2023
- **33%** of 3-8 graders are earning college-and-career-ready scores (level 4 or 5) in **math**, compared to **35%** statewide; 5,458 more needed to meet state goal of **86%**. 2023
- **86%** of 9th graders **graduate within four years**, compared to **87%** statewide; 166 more needed to meet state goal of **95%**. 2023
- **29%** of students are **chronically absent from school**, compared to **27%** statewide; 4,193 less needed to meet state goal of **11%**. 2023
- **2%** of students **drop out of high school** (116 total students), compared to **2%** statewide. 2023

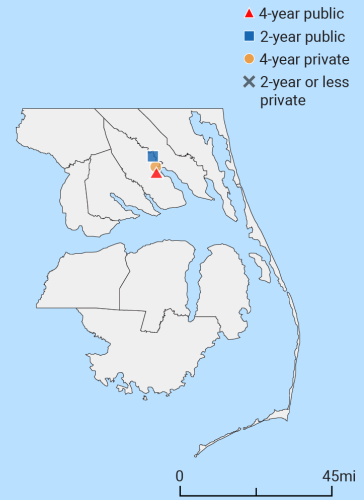

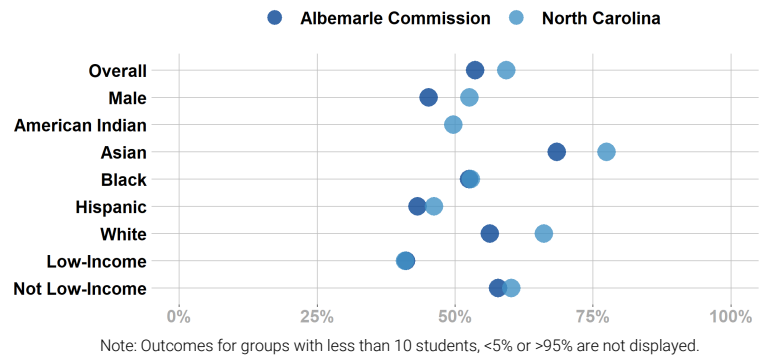

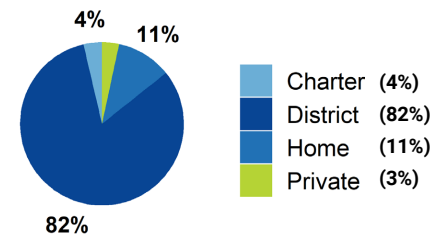
Postsecondary Enrollment Rates in Albemarle Commission, 2022



School Choice

27,698 total students were enrolled in K-12 in Albemarle Commission in the 2022-23 school year.

Access to Postsecondary Credits

Students in Albemarle Commission completed **10,064 Career & Technical Education (CTE) credentials** (**1,513 (15%) were industry-valued credentials**) and **1,239 concentrations** in 2023. The top three CTE concentrations completed include Agricultural, Food, & Natural Resources; Human Services; and Health Science.

533 high school students took at least one **AP test** (**9%**) versus **16%** in the state (2023).

672 high school students participated in **Career & College Promise programs** (**40%**) versus **36%** in the state (2023).
