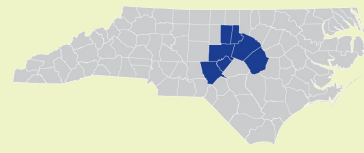

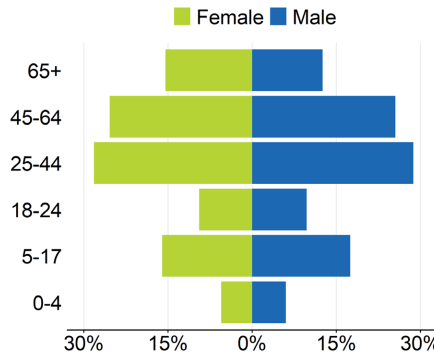

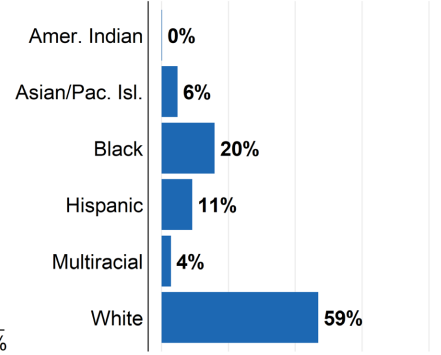

POSTSECONDARY COMPLETION

Success of Central Pines High School Graduates

- **87%** of students who enroll **persist to their second year** versus **83%** for the state. 2022
- **67%** of students who enroll **earn a degree or certificate** within 6 years versus **59%** for the state. 2022

- **7,887** of all college-goers attended **Durham TCC**

COLLEGE & CAREER ACCESS

- **65%** of seniors **completed the FAFSA** in 2023, compared to **62%** statewide; 3,090 more need to complete in 2023 to meet state goal of **80%**. 2023
- **89%** of graduates reported **intentions to enroll** in a postsecondary institution versus **74%** in the state. 2022
- **65%** of graduates **enrolled in a postsecondary institution** within 12 months versus **58%** in the state. 2022

ACADEMIC READINESS

How students in Central Pines traditional schools are currently doing:

To meet state goals, each year Central Pines needs:

- **39%** of eligible 4-year-olds **enrolled in NC Pre-K program**, compared to **53%** statewide; 2,656 more needed to meet state goal of **75%**. 2023
- **38%** of 3-8 graders are earning college-and-career-ready scores (level 4 or 5) in **reading**, compared to **30%** statewide; 43,259 more needed to meet state goal of **73%**. 2023
- **42%** of 3-8 graders are earning college-and-career-ready scores (level 4 or 5) in **math**, compared to **35%** statewide; 54,398 more needed to meet state goal of **86%**. 2023
- **90%** of 9th graders **graduate within four years**, compared to **87%** statewide; 1,279 more needed to meet state goal of **95%**. 2023
- **24%** of students are **chronically absent from school**, compared to **27%** statewide; 37,762 less needed to meet state goal of **11%**. 2023
- **2%** of students **drop out of high school** (1,698 total students), compared to **2%** statewide. 2023

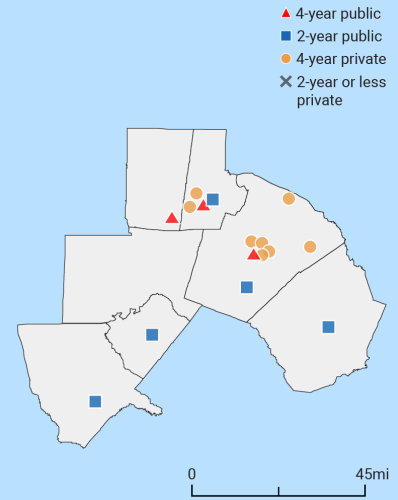

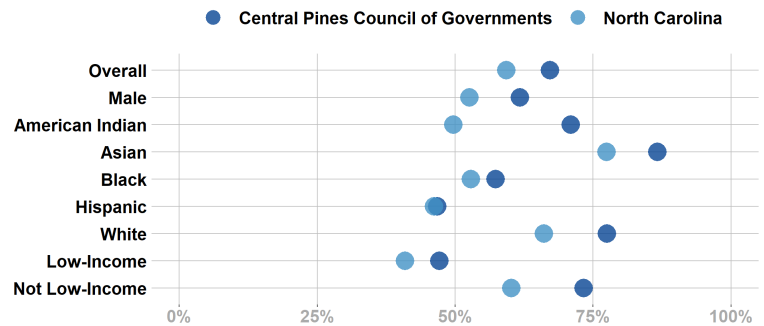

Postsecondary Enrollment Rates in Central Pines, 2022

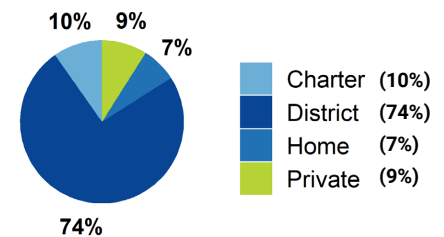

School Choice

369,317 total students were enrolled in K-12 in Central Pines in the 2022-23 school year.

Access to Postsecondary Credits

Students in Central Pines completed **49,270 Career & Technical Education (CTE) credentials (13,975 (28%) were industry-valued credentials)** and **13,316 concentrations** in 2023. The top three CTE concentrations completed include Health Science; Arts, Audio/Video Technology, & Communications; and Agricultural, Food, & Natural Resources.

23,336 high school students took at least one **AP test (26%)** versus **16%** in the state (2023).

5,308 high school students participated in **Career & College Promise programs (25%)** versus **36%** in the state (2023).
