






Educational Attainment Less high Eastern Carolina residents ages 25-44, 2022 Have Degree or **No Degree**



How students in Eastern Carolina traditional schools are currently doing:

To meet state goals, each year Eastern Carolina needs:

• 49% of eligible 4-year-olds enrolled in NC Pre-K program, compared to 53% statewide; 1,230 more needed to meet state goal of 75%. 2023

• 26% of 3-8 graders are earning college-and-career-ready scores (level 4 or 5) in reading, compared to 30% statewide; 19,304 more needed to meet state goal of 73%. 2023

 28% of 3-8 graders are earning college-and-career-ready scores (level 4 or 5) in math, compared to 35% statewide; 23,587 more needed to meet state goal of 86%, 2023

• 85% of 9th graders graduate within four years, compared to 87% statewide: 717 more needed to meet state goal of 95%. 2023

• 28% of students are chronically absent from school, compared to 27% statewide; 15,917 less needed to meet state goal of 11%. 2023

Access to Postsecondary Credits

Students in Eastern Carolina completed 22,971 Career & Technical Education (CTE) credentials (4,336 (19%) were industry-valued credentials) and 4,499 concentrations in 2023. The top three CTE concentrations completed include Human Services; Health Science; and Agricultural, Food, & Natural Resources.
