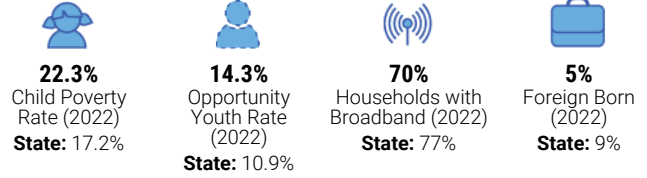

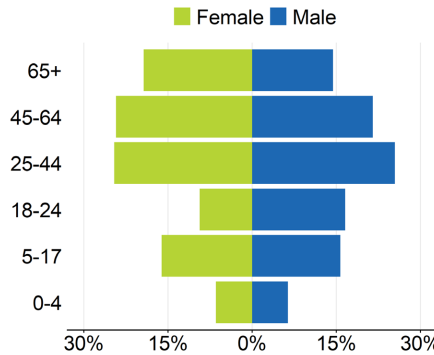

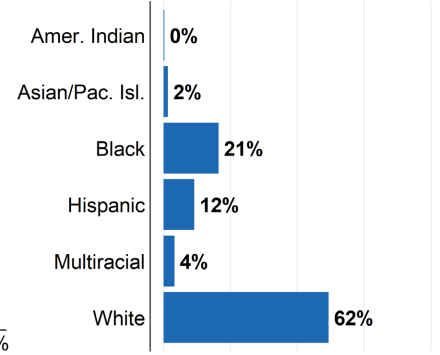

Age Structure, 2022

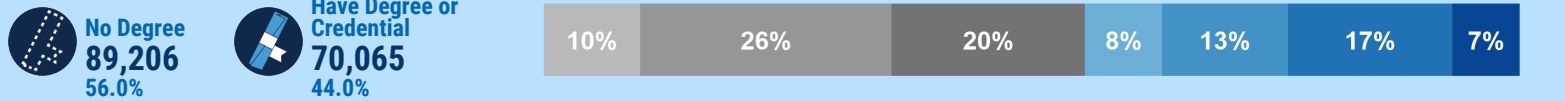


Race/Ethnicity, 2022

Success of Eastern Carolina High School Graduates

- **79%** of students who enroll **persist to their second year** versus **83%** for the state. 2022
- **56%** of students who enroll **earn a degree or certificate** within 6 years versus **59%** for the state. 2022

Top destinations of all college-goers, Fall 2023

- **5,357** of all college-goers attended **Coastal Carolina CC**
- **4,595** of all college-goers attended **Wayne CC**
- **4,515** of all college-goers attended **Craven CC**

Adult Learners

Eastern Carolina resident enrollments in NC Community Colleges, Fall 2022

- 1,004** Basic Skills
- 12,197** Continuing Education
- 3,541** Curriculum

- **57%** of seniors **completed the FAFSA** in 2023, compared to **62%** statewide; 1,312 more need to complete in 2023 to meet state goal of **80%**. 2023
- **77%** of graduates reported **intentions to enroll** in a postsecondary institution versus **74%** in the state. 2022
- **52%** of graduates **enrolled in a postsecondary institution** within 12 months versus **58%** in the state. 2022

How students in Eastern Carolina traditional schools are currently doing:

To meet state goals, each year Eastern Carolina needs:

- **49%** of eligible 4-year-olds **enrolled in NC Pre-K program**, compared to **53%** statewide; 1,230 more needed to meet state goal of **75%**. 2023
- **26%** of 3-8 graders are earning college-and-career-ready scores (level 4 or 5) in **reading**, compared to **30%** statewide; 19,304 more needed to meet state goal of **73%**. 2023
- **28%** of 3-8 graders are earning college-and-career-ready scores (level 4 or 5) in **math**, compared to **35%** statewide; 23,587 more needed to meet state goal of **86%**. 2023
- **85%** of 9th graders **graduate within four years**, compared to **87%** statewide; 717 more needed to meet state goal of **95%**. 2023
- **28%** of students are **chronically absent from school**, compared to **27%** statewide; 15,917 less needed to meet state goal of **11%**. 2023
- **2%** of students **drop out of high school** (560 total students), compared to **2%** statewide. 2023

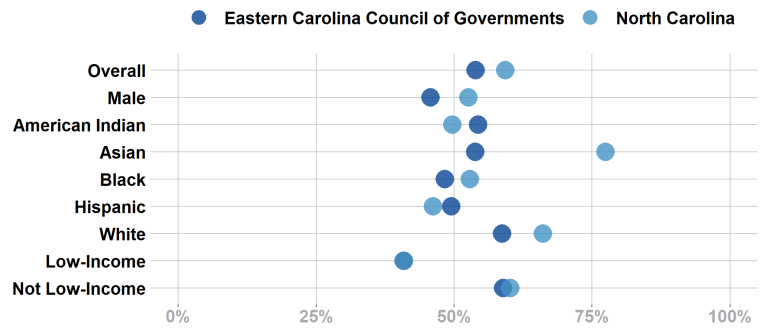

Postsecondary Enrollment Rates in Eastern Carolina, 2022

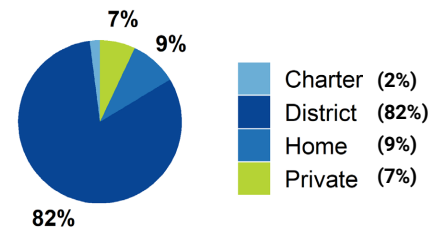

106,900 total students were enrolled in K-12 in Eastern Carolina in the 2022-23 school year.

Access to Postsecondary Credits

Students in Eastern Carolina completed **22,971 Career & Technical Education (CTE) credentials (4,336 (19%) were industry-valued credentials) and 4,499 concentrations** in 2023. The top three CTE concentrations completed include Human Services; Health Science; and Agricultural, Food, & Natural Resources.

1,974 high school students took at least one **AP test (8%)** versus **16%** in the state (2023).

2,336 high school students participated in **Career & College Promise programs (39%)** versus **36%** in the state (2023).
