#### **Chronic Absenteeism**

36% of Alamance County students are chronically absent from school, above the suburban county average of 25%.



#### **Math Performance**

27% of Alamance County 3-8 graders earn college-and-career-ready scores in Math, below the suburban county average of 36%.



#### **Reading Performance**

24% of Alamance County 3-8 graders earn college-and-career-ready scores in Reading, below the suburban county average of 31%.






### 61% of seniors completed the FAFSA in 2023, compared to 62% statewide; 271 more need to complete in 2023 to meet state goal of 80%.

- 68% of graduates reported intentions to enroll in a postsecondary institution versus 73% in peer counties. 2022
- 50% of graduates enrolled in a postsecondary institution within 12 months versus 57% in peer counties. 2022

#### How students in Alamance County traditional schools are doing:

- 47% of eligible 4-year-olds enrolled in NC Pre-K program, compared to 53% statewide; 280 more needed to meet state goal of 75%. 2023
- 24% of 3-8 graders are earning college-and-career-ready scores (level 4 or 5) in **reading**, compared to **30%** statewide; 6,279 more needed to meet state goal of 73%. 2023
- 27% of 3-8 graders are earning college-and-career-ready scores (level 4) or 5) in math, compared to 35% statewide; 6,001 more needed to meet state goal of 86%. 2023
- 85% of 9th graders graduate within four years, compared to 87% statewide; 179 more needed to meet state goal of 95%. 2023
- 36% of students are chronically absent from school, compared to 27% statewide; 5,876 less needed to meet state goal of 11%. 2023



#### **Access to Postsecondary Credits**

Students in Alamance County completed 6,013 Career & Technical Education (CTE) credentials (1,398 (23%) were industry-valued credentials) and 1,173

concentrations in 2023. The top three CTE concentrations completed include Human Services; Arts, Audio/Video Technology, & Communications; and Agricultural, Food, &
