


First-time Curriculum Enrollments











Access to Postsecondary Credits

Students in Ashe County completed 2,121 Career & Technical Education (CTE) credentials (121 (6%) were industry-valued credentials) and 169 concentrations in 2023. The top three CTE concentrations completed include Manufacturing; Agricultural, Food, & Natural Resources; and Health Science.

94 high school students took at least one **AP test** (10%) versus 8% in peer counties (2023).



108 high school students participated in Career & College Promise programs (52%) versus 51% in peer counties (2023).
