






NC Community College Enrollment





How students in Bertie County traditional schools are doing:

- Bertie County has met the goal for Pre-K enrollment. (Goal: 75%). 2023
- 18% of 3-8 graders are earning college-and-career-ready scores (level 4 or 5) in **reading**, compared to **30%** statewide; 539 more needed to meet state goal of **73%**. 2023
- 16% of 3-8 graders are earning college-and-career-ready scores (level 4 or 5) in **math**, compared to **35%** statewide; 550 more needed to meet state goal of **86%**. 2023
- 89% of 9th graders graduate within four years, compared to 87% statewide: 8 more needed to meet state goal of 95%. 2023
- 36% of students are chronically absent from school, compared to 27% statewide; 469 less needed to meet state goal of 11%. 2023



Access to Postsecondary Credits

Students in Bertie County completed **255 Career & Technical Education (CTE) credentials (40 (16%) were industry-valued credentials) and 121 concentrations** in 2023. The top three CTE concentrations completed include Human Services; Science, Technology, Engineering, & Mathematics; and Health Science.



Less than 10 high school students took at least one AP test (NA) versus 8% in peer counties (2023).



87 high school students participated in Career & College Promise programs (67%) versus 51% in peer counties (2023).
