





Access to Postsecondary Credits

Students in Burke County completed 6,236 Career & Technical Education (CTE) credentials (547 (9%) were industry-valued credentials) and 538 concentrations in 2023. The top three CTE concentrations completed include Human Services; Architecture and Construction: and Health Science

524 high school students took at least one AP test (14%) versus 8% in peer counties (2023).




477 high school students participated in Career & College Promise programs (54%) versus 43% in peer counties (2023).


