






NC Community College Enrollment




First-time Curriculum Enrollments



How students in Cabarrus County traditional schools are doing:

- 47% of eligible 4-year-olds enrolled in NC Pre-K program, compared to 53% statewide; 211 more needed to meet state goal of 75%. 2023
- 35% of 3-8 graders are earning college-and-career-ready scores (level 4 or 5) in **reading**, compared to **30%** statewide; 9,350 more needed to meet state goal of **73%.** 2023
- 41% of 3-8 graders are earning college-and-career-ready scores (level 4 or 5) in **math**, compared to **35%** statewide; 8,213 more needed to meet state goal of **86%**. 2023
- 89% of 9th graders graduate within four years, compared to 87% statewide; 213 more needed to meet state goal of 95%. 2023
- 22% of students are chronically absent from school, compared to 27% statewide; 4,780 less needed to meet state goal of 11%. 2023



Services; Health Science; and Architecture and Construction.







- 38% of 3-8 graders are earning college-and-career-ready scores (level 4 or 5) in reading, compared to 30% statewide; 5,600 more needed to meet state goal
- 45% of 3-8 graders are earning college-and-career-ready scores (level 4 or 5) in math, compared to 35% statewide; 6,608 more needed to meet state goal of
- 89% of 9th graders graduate within four years, compared to 87% statewide; 173 more needed to meet state goal of 95%. 2023



Postsecondary Enrollment Rates (within 12 months) for Select Groups in Cabarrus County Schools, 2022






Percentage of students enrolled in North Carolina postsecondary institution who graduate within 6 years of enrollment, 2022









Postsecondary Enrollment Rates (within 12 months) for Select Groups in Kannapolis City Schools, 2022




