#### How students in Caldwell County traditional schools are doing:

· 62% of eligible 4-year-olds enrolled in NC Pre-K program, compared to 53% statewide; 59 more needed to meet state goal of 75%. 2023

 26% of 3-8 graders are earning college-and-career-ready scores (level 4) or 5) in reading, compared to 30% statewide; 2,799 more needed to meet state goal of 73%. 2023

 28% of 3-8 graders are earning college-and-career-ready scores (level 4 or 5) in math, compared to 35% statewide; 2,692 more needed to meet state goal of 86%. 2023

• 84% of 9th graders graduate within four years, compared to 87% statewide; 97 more needed to meet state goal of 95%. 2023

• 28% of students are chronically absent from school, compared to 27% statewide; 1,811 less needed to meet state goal of 11%. 2023

#### **Access to Postsecondary Credits**

Students in Caldwell County completed 6,668 Career & Technical Education (CTE) credentials (1,084 (16%) were industry-valued credentials) and 497 concentrations in 2023. The top three CTE concentrations completed include Human Services; Health Science: and Architecture and Construction.


