Postsecondary Enrollment Rates for Select Groups in Catawba County, 2022









Postsecondary Enrollment Rates (within 12 months) for Select Groups in Catawba County Schools, 2022





Percentage of students enrolled in North Carolina postsecondary institution who graduate within 6 years of enrollment, 2022









Percentage of students enrolled in North Carolina postsecondary institution who graduate







Postsecondary Enrollment Rates (within 12 months) for Select Groups in Newton Conover City Schools, 2022




