



#### Access to Postsecondary Credits

Students in Chatham County completed 4,673 Career & Technical Education (CTE) credentials (552 (12%) were industry-valued credentials) and 503 concentrations in 2023. The top three CTE concentrations completed include Health Science; Agricultural, Food, & Natural Resources; and Human Services.



511 high school students took at least one AP test (17%) versus 8% in peer counties (2023).



416 high school students participated in Career & College Promise programs (58%) versus 43% in peer counties (2023).


