Earning College Credit in High School

29% of Chowan County graduates participated in Career & College Promise programs, below the rural - non-metro county average of 51%. Also, 6% of high school students took at least one AP exam, below the peer county average of 8%



FAFSA Completion

54% of Chowan County high school seniors complete the FAFSA, below the rural - nonmetro county average of 61%.










NC Community College Enrollment




First-time Curriculum Enrollments



Success of Chowan County High School Graduates

- **79%** of students who enroll **persist to their second year** versus **78%** in peer counties. 2022
- 56% of students who enroll earn a degree or certificate within 6 years versus 55% in peer counties. 2022

- 26 of all college-goers attended Martin CC




• 54% of seniors completed the FAFSA in 2023, compared to 62% statewide; 30 more need to complete in 2023 to meet state goal of 80%. 2023

- 65% of graduates reported intentions to enroll in a postsecondary institution versus 68% in peer counties. 2022
- 41% of graduates enrolled in a postsecondary institution within 12 months versus 52% in peer counties. 2022



52% of Chowan County students have **parents with no college degree** (either 2- or 4-year) versus **55%** in peer counties.

How students in Chowan County traditional schools are doing:

- Chowan County has met the goal for Pre-K enrollment. (Goal: 75%). 2023
- ullet 22% of 3-8 graders are earning college-and-career-ready scores (level 4 or 5) in **reading**, compared to **30%** statewide; 510 more needed to meet state goal of **73%.** 2023
- 25% of 3-8 graders are earning college-and-career-ready scores (level 4 or 5) in **math**, compared to **35%** statewide; 485 more needed to meet state goal of **86%**. 2023
- 84% of 9th graders graduate within four years, compared to 87% statewide; 15 more needed to meet state goal of 95%. 2023
- 28% of students are chronically absent from school, compared to 27% statewide; 321 less needed to meet state goal of 11%. 2023



Chowan County has a **student-to-school counselor ratio** of **252:1** versus **325:1** in peer counties. 2023



Access to Postsecondary Credits

Students in Chowan County completed **873 Career & Technical Education (CTE) credentials (88 (10%) were industry-valued credentials) and 123 concentrations** in 2023. The top three CTE concentrations completed include Health Science; Agricultural, Food, & Natural Resources; and Human Services.



33 high school students took at least one AP test (6%) versus 8% in peer counties (2023).



36 high school students participated in Career & College Promise programs (29%) versus 51% in peer counties (2023).
