







Access to Postsecondary Credits

Students in Cumberland County completed 16,012 Career & Technical Education (CTE) credentials (3,242 (20%) were industry-valued credentials) and 2,324 concentrations in 2023. The top three CTE concentrations completed include Law, Public Safety, Corrections, & Security; Human Services; and Health Science.



· 65% of seniors completed the FAFSA in 2023, compared to 62% statewide; 456 more need to complete in 2023 to meet state goal of 80%.

51% of Cumberland County students have parents with no college degree (either 2- or 4-year) versus 48% in peer counties.

How students in Cumberland County traditional schools are doing:

• 41% of eligible 4-year-olds enrolled in NC Pre-K program, compared to 53% statewide; 1,019 more needed to meet state goal of 75%. 2023

 28% of 3-8 graders are earning college-and-career-ready scores (level 4) or 5) in reading, compared to 30% statewide; 12,958 more needed to meet state goal of 73%. 2023

 26% of 3-8 graders are earning college-and-career-ready scores (level 4 or 5) in math, compared to 35% statewide; 13,458 more needed to meet state goal of 86%. 2023
