82% of Dare County high school graduates who enroll in postsecondary persist to their second year, below the state average of 83%.









How students in Dare County traditional schools are doing:

- Dare County has met the goal for Pre-K enrollment. (Goal: 75%). 2023
- **36**% of 3-8 graders are earning college-and-career-ready scores (level 4 or 5) in **reading**, compared to **30**% statewide; 1,123 more needed to meet state goal of **73%**. 2023
- 41% of 3-8 graders are earning college-and-career-ready scores (level 4 or 5) in **math**, compared to **35%** statewide; 1,029 more needed to meet state goal of **86%**. 2023
- 93% of 9th graders graduate within four years, compared to 87% statewide; 11 more needed to meet state goal of 95%. 2023
- 31% of students are chronically absent from school, compared to 27% statewide; 1,039 less needed to meet state goal of 11%. 2023



Dare County has a **student-to-school counselor ratio** of **310:1** versus **325:1** in peer counties. 2023



Access to Postsecondary Credits

Students in Dare County completed **2,581 Career & Technical Education (CTE) credentials (537 (21%) were industry-valued credentials) and 218 concentrations** in 2023. The top three CTE concentrations completed include Arts, Audio/Video Technology, & Communications; Architecture and Construction; and Health Science.



329 high school students took at least one AP test (19%) versus 8% in peer counties (2023).



205 high school students participated in Career & College Promise programs (46%) versus 51% in peer counties (2023).
