



How students in Davie County traditional schools are doing:

- Davie County has met the goal for Pre-K enrollment. (Goal: 75%). 2023
- 33% of 3-8 graders are earning college-and-career-ready scores (level 4 or 5) in **reading**, compared to **30%** statewide; 1,462 more needed to meet state goal of 73%. 2023
- 42% of 3-8 graders are earning college-and-career-ready scores (level 4 or 5) in math, compared to 35% statewide; 1,212 more needed to meet state goal of 86%, 2023
- 88% of 9th graders graduate within four years, compared to 87% statewide; 33 more needed to meet state goal of 95%. 2023
- 23% of students are chronically absent from school, compared to 27% statewide: 716 less needed to meet state goal of 11%, 2023



Access to Postsecondary Credits

Students in Davie County completed 2,015 Career & Technical Education (CTE) credentials (495 (25%) were industry-valued credentials) and 363 concentrations in 2023. The top three CTE concentrations completed include Science, Technology, Engineering, & Mathematics; Arts, Audio/Video Technology, & Communications; and Architecture and Construction.



262 high school students took at least one AP test (14%) versus 8% in peer counties (2023).



171 high school students participated in Career & College Promise programs (41%) versus **43%** in peer counties (2023)
