







Access to Postsecondary Credits

Students in Franklin County completed **3,416 Career & Technical Education (CTE)** credentials (**452 (13%) were industry-valued credentials) and 441 concentrations** in 2023. The top three CTE concentrations completed include Agricultural, Food, & Natural Resources; Hospitality & Tourism; and Human Services.



How students in Franklin County traditional schools are doing:

- 45% of eligible 4-year-olds enrolled in NC Pre-K program, compared to 53% statewide; 104 more needed to meet state goal of 75% . 2023

• 24% of 3-8 graders are earning college-and-career-ready scores (level 4 or 5) in reading, compared to **30%** statewide; 2,159 more needed to meet state goal of **73%.** 2023

• 27% of 3-8 graders are earning college-and-career-ready scores (level 4 or 5) in **math**, compared to **35%** statewide; 2,024 more needed to meet state goal of **86%**. 2023

• 83% of 9th graders graduate within four years, compared to 87% statewide; 79 more needed to meet state goal of 95%. 2023

- 29% of students are chronically absent from school, compared to 27% statewide; 1,468 less needed to meet state goal of 11% . 2023
