




### **First-time Curriculum Enrollments**



 55% of seniors completed the FAFSA in 2023, compared to 62% statewide; 488 more need to complete in 2023 to meet state goal of 80%.

• 66% of graduates reported intentions to enroll in a postsecondary institution versus 73% in peer counties. 2022

• **49%** of graduates **enrolled in a postsecondary institution** within 12 months versus **57%** in peer counties. 2022

POSTSECONDARY COMPLETION

53% of Gaston County students have parents with no college degree (either 2- or 4-year) versus 48% in peer counties.

#### How students in Gaston County traditional schools are doing:

• 69% of eligible 4-year-olds enrolled in NC Pre-K program, compared to 53% statewide; 75 more needed to meet state goal of 75%. 2023

• 26% of 3-8 graders are earning college-and-career-ready scores (level 4 or 5) in reading, compared to 30% statewide; 8,235 more needed to meet state goal of 73%. 2023

31% of 3-8 graders are earning college-and-career-ready scores (level 4 or 5) in math, compared to 35% statewide; 7,661 more needed to meet state goal of 86%. 2023

• 85% of 9th graders graduate within four years, compared to 87% statewide; 237 more needed to meet state goal of 95%. 2023

• 27% of students are chronically absent from school, compared to 27% statewide; 4,963 less needed to meet state goal of 11%. 2023




CADEMIC READINESS

Gaston County has a **student-to-school counselor ratio** of **274:1** versus **327:1** in peer counties. 2023

#### Access to Postsecondary Credits

Students in Gaston County completed **7,720 Career & Technical Education (CTE)** credentials (3,196 (41%) were industry-valued credentials) and 1,793 concentrations in 2023. The top three CTE concentrations completed include Arts, Audio/Video Technology, & Communications; Health Science; and Human Services.






706 high school students participated in Career & College Promise programs (33%) versus 39% in peer counties (2023).
