





- 79% of graduates reported intentions to enroll in a postsecondary institution versus 81% in peer counties. 2022

How students in Guilford County traditional schools are doing:

- 71% of eligible 4-year-olds enrolled in NC Pre-K program, compared to 53% statewide; 107 more needed to meet state goal of 75%. 2023
- 27% of 3-8 graders are earning college-and-career-ready scores (level 4 or 5) in **reading**, compared to **30%** statewide; 17,840 more needed to meet state goal of 73%. 2023
- 29% of 3-8 graders are earning college-and-career-ready scores (level 4 or 5) in math, compared to 35% statewide; 17,075 more needed to meet state goal of 86%. 2023
- 91% of 9th graders graduate within four years, compared to 87% statewide; 237 more needed to meet state goal of 95%. 2023
- 31% of students are chronically absent from school, compared to 27% statewide; 14,277 less needed to meet state goal of 11%. 2023



Access to Postsecondary Credits

Students in Guilford County completed 8,250 Career & Technical Education (CTE) credentials (1,451 (18%) were industry-valued credentials) and 2,741

concentrations in 2023. The top three CTE concentrations completed include Health Science; Arts, Audio/Video Technology, & Communications; and Science, Technology, Engineering, & Mathematics.



5,650 high school students took at least one AP test (27%) versus 26% in peer counties (2023)



1,315 high school students participated in Career & College Promise programs (24%) versus **21%** in peer counties (2023)
