

Access to Postsecondary Credits

Students in Henderson County completed 2,105 Career & Technical Education (CTE) credentials (766 (36%) were industry-valued credentials) and 613 concentrations in 2023. The top three CTE concentrations completed include Architecture and Construction; Manufacturing; and Health Science.





How students in Henderson County traditional schools are doing:

54% of Henderson County students have parents with no college

• 28% of eligible 4-year-olds enrolled in NC Pre-K program, compared to 53% statewide; 217 more needed to meet state goal of 75%. 2023

• 33% of 3-8 graders are earning college-and-career-ready scores (level 4 or 5) in reading, compared to 30% statewide; 3,003 more needed to meet state goal of 73%. 2023

 40% of 3-8 graders are earning college-and-career-ready scores (level 4 or 5) in math, compared to 35% statewide; 2,631 more needed to meet state goal of 86%. 2023

• 90% of 9th graders graduate within four years, compared to 87% statewide; 51 more needed to meet state goal of 95%. 2023

• 21% of students are chronically absent from school, compared to 27% statewide; 1,340 less needed to meet state goal of 11%. 2023
