



Postsecondary Enrollment Rates for Select Groups in Hoke County, 2022



#### School Choice

9,975 total students were enrolled in K-12 in Hoke County in the 2022-23 school year.





#### Access to Postsecondary Credits

Students in Hoke County completed 4,660 Career & Technical Education (CTE) credentials (250 (5%) were industry-valued credentials) and 303 concentrations in 2023. The top three CTE concentrations completed include Health Science; Arts, Audio/Video Technology, & Communications; and Law, Public Safety, Corrections, & Security

309 high school students participated in Career & College Promise programs (54%) versus **43%** in peer counties (2023)

# 57% of Hoke County students have parents with no college degree (either 2- or 4-year) versus 55% in peer counties.

## How students in Hoke County traditional schools are doing:

• Hoke County has met the goal for Pre-K enrollment. (Goal: 75%). 2023

• 22% of 3-8 graders are earning college-and-career-ready scores (level 4 CADEMIC READINESS or 5) in reading, compared to 30% statewide; 2,572 more needed to meet state goal of 73%. 2023

• 23% of 3-8 graders are earning college-and-career-ready scores (level 4 or 5) in math, compared to 35% statewide; 2,573 more needed to meet state goal of 86%, 2023

• 87% of 9th graders graduate within four years, compared to 87% statewide; 51 more needed to meet state goal of 95%. 2023

· 32% of students are chronically absent from school, compared to 27% statewide: 2,004 less needed to meet state goal of 11%, 2023



Hoke County has a student-to-school counselor ratio of 355:1 versus 362:1 in peer counties. 2023



1% of students drop out of high school (34 total students), compared to 2% statewide. 2023
