





Access to Postsecondary Credits

Students in Iredell County completed 5,663 Career & Technical Education (CTE) credentials (1,341 (24%) were industry-valued credentials) and 1,475 concentrations in 2023. The top three CTE concentrations completed include Human Services; Agricultural, Food, & Natural Resources; and Health Science.





Postsecondary Enrollment Rates (within 12 months) for Select Groups in Iredell-Statesville Schools, 2022










