#### **Chronic Absenteeism**

33% of Jackson County students are chronically absent from school, above the rural - non-metro county average of 29%.







#### How students in Jackson County traditional schools are doing:

- 38% of eligible 4-year-olds enrolled in NC Pre-K program, compared to 53% statewide; 74 more needed to meet state goal of 75%. 2023
- 26% of 3-8 graders are earning college-and-career-ready scores (level 4 or 5) in **reading**, compared to **30%** statewide; 917 more needed to meet state goal of 73%. 2023
- 30% of 3-8 graders are earning college-and-career-ready scores (level 4 or 5) in math, compared to 35% statewide; 847 more needed to meet state goal of 86%. 2023
- 88% of 9th graders graduate within four years, compared to 87% statewide; 22 more needed to meet state goal of 95%. 2023
- 33% of students are chronically absent from school, compared to 27% statewide; 798 less needed to meet state goal of 11%. 2023



#### **Access to Postsecondary Credits**

Students in Jackson County completed 649 Career & Technical Education (CTE) credentials (63 (10%) were industry-valued credentials) and 131 concentrations in 2023. The top three CTE concentrations completed include Agricultural, Food, & Natural Resources; Health Science; and Law, Public Safety, Corrections, & Security.



55 high school students took at least one AP test (<5%) versus 8% in peer counties (2023).



134 high school students participated in Career & College Promise programs (49%) versus 51% in peer counties (2023).
