




51% of seniors completed the FAFSA in 2023, compared to 62% statewide; 21 more need to complete in 2023 to meet state goal of 80%.

How students in Jones County traditional schools are doing:

- Jones County has met the goal for Pre-K enrollment. (Goal: 75%). 2023
- 26% of 3-8 graders are earning college-and-career-ready scores (level 4 or 5) in **reading**, compared to **30%** statewide; 277 more needed to meet state goal of 73%. 2023
- 27% of 3-8 graders are earning college-and-career-ready scores (level 4 or 5) in math, compared to 35% statewide; 274 more needed to meet state goal of 86%, 2023
- · Jones County has met the goal for high school graduation within four years. (Goal: 95%). 2023
- 29% of students are chronically absent from school, compared to 27% statewide: 193 less needed to meet state goal of 11%, 2023



Jones County has a student-to-school counselor ratio of 244:1 versus **362:1** in peer counties. 2023



Access to Postsecondary Credits

Students in Jones County completed 535 Career & Technical Education (CTE) credentials (40 (7%) were industry-valued credentials) and 74 concentrations in 2023. The top three CTE concentrations completed include Agricultural, Food, & Natural Resources; Health Science; and Transportation, Distribution, & Logistics.



Less than 10 high school students took at least one AP test (NA) versus 8% in peer counties (2023).



32 high school students participated in Career & College Promise programs (42%) versus 43% in peer counties (2023).
