









How students in Mitchell County traditional schools are doing:

- 0% of eligible 4-year-olds enrolled in NC Pre-K program, compared to 53% statewide; 47 more needed to meet state goal of 75%. 2023
- 29% of 3-8 graders are earning college-and-career-ready scores (level 4) or 5) in **reading**, compared to **30%** statewide; 430 more needed to meet state goal of 73%. 2023
- 30% of 3-8 graders are earning college-and-career-ready scores (level 4 or 5) in math, compared to 35% statewide; 426 more needed to meet state goal of 86%. 2023
- 84% of 9th graders graduate within four years, compared to 87% statewide; 17 more needed to meet state goal of 95%. 2023
- 22% of students are chronically absent from school, compared to 27% statewide; 187 less needed to meet state goal of 11%. 2023



Access to Postsecondary Credits

Students in Mitchell County completed 617 Career & Technical Education (CTE) credentials (254 (41%) were industry-valued credentials) and 176 concentrations in 2023. The top three CTE concentrations completed include Human Services; Health Science: and Architecture and Construction.



52 high school students took at least one AP test (9%) versus 8% in peer counties (2023).



100 high school students participated in Career & College Promise programs (75%) versus 51% in peer counties (2023).
