





NC Community College Enrollment







Access to Postsecondary Credits

Students in Nash County completed 2,876 Career & Technical Education (CTE) credentials (587 (20%) were industry-valued credentials) and 817 concentrations in 2023. The top three CTE concentrations completed include Human Services; Health Science; and Agricultural, Food, & Natural Resources.

256 high school students took at least one AP test (6%) versus 8% in peer counties (2023).



480 high school students participated in Career & College Promise programs (45%) versus 43% in peer counties (2023).

• 57% of seniors completed the FAFSA in 2023, compared to 62% statewide; 233 more need to complete in 2023 to meet state goal of 80%. 2023

• 73% of graduates reported intentions to enroll in a postsecondary institution versus 68% in peer counties. 2022

 47% of graduates enrolled in a postsecondary institution within 12 months versus 51% in peer counties. 2022

How students in Nash County traditional schools are doing:

· 66% of eligible 4-year-olds enrolled in NC Pre-K program, compared to 53% statewide; 42 more needed to meet state goal of 75%. 2023

• 18% of 3-8 graders are earning college-and-career-ready scores (level 4 or 5) in reading, compared to 30% statewide; 4,445 more needed to meet state goal of 73%. 2023

 17% of 3-8 graders are earning college-and-career-ready scores (level 4 or 5) in math, compared to 35% statewide; 4,458 more needed to meet state goal of 86%. 2023

• 85% of 9th graders graduate within four years, compared to 87% statewide; 128 more needed to meet state goal of 95%. 2023

· 29% of students are chronically absent from school, compared to 27% statewide; 2,742 less needed to meet state goal of 11%. 2023


