








First-time Curriculum Enrollments

- 85% of students who enroll **persist to their second year** versus 86% in peer counties. 2022
- 61% of students who enroll earn a degree or certificate within 6 years versus 62% in peer counties. 2022




- 54% of seniors completed the FAFSA in 2023, compared to 62% statewide; 481 more need to complete in 2023 to meet state goal of 80%.
- 83% of graduates reported **intentions to enroll** in a postsecondary institution versus 81% in peer counties. 2022
- **64%** of graduates **enrolled in a postsecondary institution** within 12 months versus **64%** in peer counties. 2022



34% of New Hanover County students have **parents with no college degree** (either 2- or 4-year) versus **37%** in peer counties.

How students in New Hanover County traditional schools are doing:

- 68% of eligible 4-year-olds enrolled in NC Pre-K program, compared to 53% statewide; 60 more needed to meet state goal of 75%. 2023
- 37% of 3-8 graders are earning college-and-career-ready scores (level 4 or 5) in **reading**, compared to **30%** statewide; 5,323 more needed to meet state goal of **73%.** 2023
- 45% of 3-8 graders are earning college-and-career-ready scores (level 4 or 5) in math, compared to 35% statewide; 4,503 more needed to meet state goal of 86%.
- 88% of 9th graders graduate within four years, compared to 87% statewide; 144 more needed to meet state goal of 95%. 2023
- 27% of students are chronically absent from school, compared to 27% statewide; 4,110 less needed to meet state goal of 11%. 2023



School Choice

32,903 total students were enrolled in K-12 in New Hanover County in the 2022-23 school year.

Access to Postsecondary Credits

Students in New Hanover County completed 1,943 Career & Technical Education (CTE) credentials (776 (40%) were industry-valued credentials) and 1,221 concentrations in 2023. The top three CTE concentrations completed include Business Management & Administration; Arts, Audio/Video Technology, & Communications; and Hospitality & Tourism.



1,491 high school students took at least one **AP test (18%)** versus **26%** in peer counties (2023).



998 high school students participated in Career & College Promise programs (51%) versus 21% in peer counties (2023).
