




 68% of seniors completed the FAFSA in 2023, compared to 62% statewide; 168 more need to complete in 2023 to meet state goal of 80%.

- 82% of graduates reported intentions to enroll in a postsecondary institution versus 73% in peer counties. 2022
- 70% of graduates enrolled in a postsecondary institution within 12 months versus 57% in peer counties. 2022

How students in Orange County traditional schools are doing:

- 72% of eligible 4-year-olds enrolled in NC Pre-K program, compared to 53% statewide; 9 more needed to meet state goal of 75%. 2023
- 46% of 3-8 graders are earning college-and-career-ready scores (level 4) or 5) in reading, compared to 30% statewide; 3,407 more needed to meet state goal of 73%. 2023
- 49% of 3-8 graders are earning college-and-career-ready scores (level 4 or 5) in math, compared to 35% statewide; 3,176 more needed to meet state goal of 86%. 2023
- 92% of 9th graders graduate within four years, compared to 87% statewide; 47 more needed to meet state goal of 95%. 2023
- 22% of students are chronically absent from school, compared to 27% statewide; 2,135 less needed to meet state goal of 11%. 2023







ACADEMIC READINESS

How students in Orange County Schools are currently doing:

- 31% of 3-8 graders are earning college-and-career-ready scores (level 4 or 5) in reading, compared to 30% statewide; 1,325 more needed to meet state goal
- 36% of 3-8 graders are earning college-and-career-ready scores (level 4 or 5) in math, compared to 35% statewide; 1,604 more needed to meet state goal of
- 88% of 9th graders graduate within four years, compared to 87% statewide; 45 more needed to meet state goal of 95%. 2023



Postsecondary Enrollment Rates (within 12 months) for Select Groups in Orange County Schools, 2022






Percentage of students enrolled in North Carolina postsecondary institution who graduate within 6 years of enrollment, 2022





- 55% of 3-8 graders are earning college-and-career-ready scores (level 4 or 5) in **reading**, compared to **30%** statewide; 979 more needed to meet state goal
- 56% of 3-8 graders are earning college-and-career-ready scores (level 4 or 5) in math, compared to 35% statewide; 1,572 more needed to meet state goal of



Postsecondary Enrollment Rates (within 12 months) for Select Groups in Chapel Hill-Carrboro City Schools, 2022




