









Access to Postsecondary Credits

Students in Pamlico County completed 478 Career & Technical Education (CTE) credentials (78 (16%) were industry-valued credentials) and 65 concentrations in 2023. The top three CTE concentrations completed include Agricultural, Food, & Natural Resources; Architecture and Construction; and Law, Public Safety, Corrections, & Security





67 high school students participated in Career & College Promise programs (58%) versus **43%** in peer counties (2023)

OSTSECONDARY COMPLETION

 55% of seniors completed the FAFSA in 2023, compared to 62% statewide; 27 more need to complete in 2023 to meet state goal of 80%. 2023

• 68% of graduates reported intentions to enroll in a postsecondary institution versus 68% in peer counties. 2022

 54% of graduates enrolled in a postsecondary institution within 12 months versus 51% in peer counties. 2022

46% of Pamlico County students have parents with no college degree (either 2- or 4-year) versus 55% in peer counties.

How students in Pamlico County traditional schools are doing: • Pamlico County has met the goal for Pre-K enrollment. (Goal: 75%). 2023

• 28% of 3-8 graders are earning college-and-career-ready scores (level 4 or 5) in reading, compared to 30% statewide; 290 more needed to meet state goal of 73%. 2023

• 34% of 3-8 graders are earning college-and-career-ready scores (level 4 or 5) in math, compared to 35% statewide; 257 more needed to meet state goal of 86%, 2023

• 92% of 9th graders graduate within four years, compared to 87% statewide: 3 more needed to meet state goal of 95%, 2023

• 33% of students are chronically absent from school, compared to 27% statewide: 277 less needed to meet state goal of 11%, 2023



CADEMIC READINESS

Pamlico County has a student-to-school counselor ratio of 291:1 versus 362:1 in peer counties. 2023
