




### **NC Community College Enrollment**


 65% of seniors completed the FAFSA in 2023, compared to 62% statewide; 22 more need to complete in 2023 to meet state goal of 80%.

- 65% of graduates reported intentions to enroll in a postsecondary institution versus 68% in peer counties. 2022
- 65% of graduates enrolled in a postsecondary institution within 12 months versus 52% in peer counties. 2022



55% of Polk County students have parents with no college degree (either 2- or 4-year) versus 55% in peer counties.

### How students in Polk County traditional schools are doing:

- Polk County has met the goal for Pre-K enrollment. (Goal: 75%). 2023
- 47% of 3-8 graders are earning college-and-career-ready scores (level 4 or 5) in **reading**, compared to **30%** statewide; 375 more needed to meet state goal of 73%. 2023
- 45% of 3-8 graders are earning college-and-career-ready scores (level 4 or 5) in math, compared to 35% statewide; 396 more needed to meet state goal of 86%, 2023
- 82% of 9th graders graduate within four years, compared to 87% statewide; 25 more needed to meet state goal of 95%. 2023
- 27% of students are chronically absent from school, compared to 27% statewide: 352 less needed to meet state goal of 11%, 2023



Polk County has a student-to-school counselor ratio of 223:1 versus **325:1** in peer counties. 2023



### School Choice

2,489 total students were enrolled in K-12 in Polk County in the 2022-23 school year.

### **Access to Postsecondary Credits**

Students in Polk County completed 996 Career & Technical Education (CTE) credentials (142 (14%) were industry-valued credentials) and 141 concentrations in 2023. The top three CTE concentrations completed include Agricultural, Food, & Natural Resources; Health Science; and Information Technology.



39 high school students took at least one AP test (6%) versus 8% in peer counties (2023).



97 high school students participated in Career & College Promise programs (61%) versus 51% in peer counties (2023).
