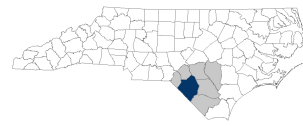

Top Opportunities for Growth

These three areas represent the biggest opportunities for Robeson County to improve future attainment outcomes.



Earning College Credit in High School

25% of Robeson County graduates participated in Career & College Promise programs, below the rural - non-metro county average of 51%. Also, <5% of high school students took at least one AP exam, below the peer county average of 8%.



NC Pre-K Enrollment

52% of Robeson County eligible 4-year-olds are enrolled in NC Pre-K, below the rural - non-metro county average of 68%.



Chronic Absenteeism

43% of Robeson County students are chronically absent from school, above the rural - non-metro county average of 29%.

Promising Attainment Practices

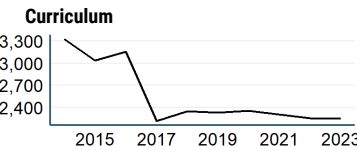

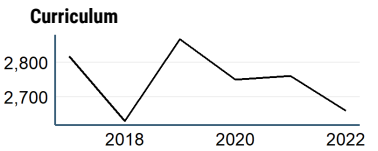

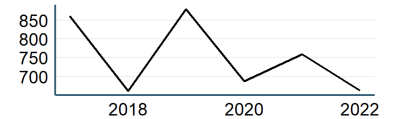

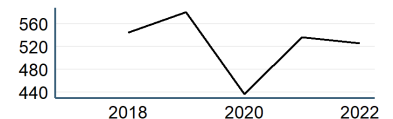

First-time Curriculum Enrollments



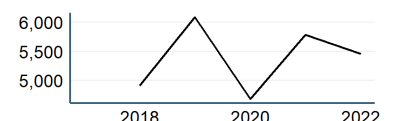

Success of Robeson County High School Graduates

- 73% of students who enroll persist to their second year versus 78% in peer counties. 2022
- 42% of students who enroll earn a degree or certificate within 6 years versus 55% in peer counties. 2022

Top destinations of all college-goers, Fall 2023

- 3,841 of all college-goers attended Robeson CC
- 694 of all college-goers attended Fayetteville TCC
- 311 of all college-goers attended Bladen CC

COLLEGE & CAREER ACCESS

59% of seniors completed the FAFSA in 2023, compared to 62% statewide; 266 more need to complete in 2023 to meet state goal of 80%. 2023

72% of graduates reported intentions to enroll in a postsecondary institution versus 68% in peer counties. 2022

44% of graduates enrolled in a postsecondary institution within 12 months versus 52% in peer counties. 2022

69% of Robeson County students have parents with no college degree (either 2- or 4-year) versus 55% in peer counties.

ACADEMIC READINESS

How students in Robeson County traditional schools are doing:

52% of eligible 4-year-olds enrolled in NC Pre-K program, compared to 53% statewide; 254 more needed to meet state goal of 75%. 2023

13% of 3-8 graders are earning college-and-career-ready scores (level 4 or 5) in reading, compared to 30% statewide; 6,817 more needed to meet state goal of 73%. 2023

16% of 3-8 graders are earning college-and-career-ready scores (level 4 or 5) in math, compared to 35% statewide; 6,544 more needed to meet state goal of 86%. 2023

79% of 9th graders graduate within four years, compared to 87% statewide; 256 more needed to meet state goal of 95%. 2023

43% of students are chronically absent from school, compared to 27% statewide; 6,960 less needed to meet state goal of 11%. 2023

Robeson County has a student-to-school counselor ratio of 312:1 versus 325:1 in peer counties. 2023

3% of students drop out of high school (203 total students), compared to 2% statewide. 2023

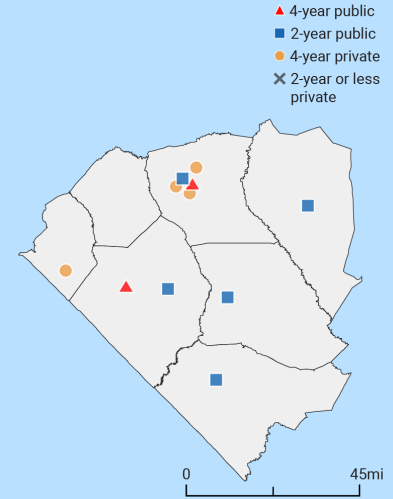

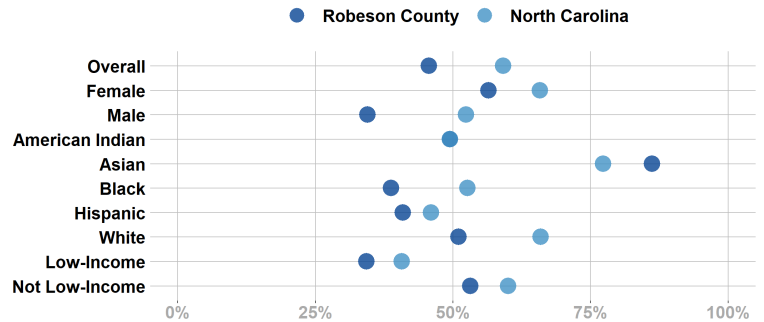

Postsecondary Enrollment Rates for Select Groups in Robeson County, 2022

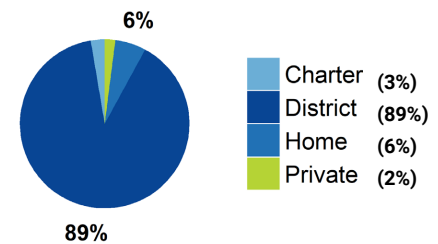

Access to Postsecondary Credits

Students in Robeson County completed 2,257 Career & Technical Education (CTE) credentials (349 (15%) were industry-valued credentials) and 1,448 concentrations in 2023. The top three CTE concentrations completed include Business Management & Administration; Agricultural, Food, & Natural Resources; and Human Services.

228 high school students took at least one AP test (<5%) versus 8% in peer counties (2023).

327 high school students participated in Career & College Promise programs (25%) versus 51% in peer counties (2023).
