






22,877 total students were enrolled in K-12 in Robeson County in the 2022-23 school year.

Access to Postsecondary Credits

Students in Robeson County completed **2,257 Career & Technical Education (CTE) credentials (349 (15%) were industry-valued credentials) and 1,448 concentrations** in 2023. The top three CTE concentrations completed include Business Management & Administration; Agricultural, Food, & Natural Resources; and Human Services.



POSTSECONDARY COMPLETION
