## **Top Opportunities** for Growth

These three areas represent the biggest opportunities for Surry County to improve future attainment outcomes.



#### **FAFSA Completion**

54% of Surry County high school seniors complete the FAFSA, below the rural - nonmetro county average of 61%.



#### **School Counselors**

Surry County has a student-to-school counselor ratio of 383:1, above the rural - nonmetro county average of 325:1.



#### **NC Pre-K Enrollment**

66% of Surry County eligible 4-year-olds are enrolled in NC Pre-K, below the rural - nonmetro county average of 68%.

## **Promising Attainment Practices**

The new Promising Attainment Practices Database is a curated, searchable, and filterable collection of about 250 county, region, and state-level initiatives and programs that directly address various components of the state's attainment challenge. 


#### **NC Community College Enrollment**


## 54% of seniors completed the FAFSA in 2023, compared to 62% statewide; 198 more need to complete in 2023 to meet state goal of 80%.

- 74% of graduates reported intentions to enroll in a postsecondary institution versus 68% in peer counties. 2022
- 57% of graduates enrolled in a postsecondary institution within 12 months versus 52% in peer counties. 2022



58% of Surry County students have parents with no college degree (either 2- or 4-year) versus 55% in peer counties.

- 66% of eligible 4-year-olds enrolled in NC Pre-K program, compared to 53% statewide; 37 more needed to meet state goal of 75%. 2023
- 31% of 3-8 graders are earning college-and-career-ready scores (level 4 or 5) in reading, compared to 30% statewide; 2,457 more needed to meet state goal of 73%. 2023
- 40% of 3-8 graders are earning college-and-career-ready scores (level 4 or 5) in math, compared to 35% statewide; 2,058 more needed to meet state goal of 86%. 2023
- 90% of 9th graders graduate within four years, compared to 87% statewide; 40 more needed to meet state goal of 95%. 2023











Percentage of students enrolled in North Carolina postsecondary institution who graduate within 6 years of enrollment, 2022



- 36% of 3-8 graders are earning college-and-career-ready scores (level 4 or 5) in reading, compared to 30% statewide; 208 more needed to meet state goal of 73%, 2023





Percentage of students enrolled in North Carolina postsecondary institution who graduate within 6 years of enrollment, 2022





Postsecondary Enrollment Rates (within 12 months) for Select Groups in Mount Airy City Schools, 2022




