




First-time Curriculum Enrollments





Access to Postsecondary Credits

Students in Swain County completed 244 Career & Technical Education (CTE) credentials (180 (74%) were industry-valued credentials) and 138 concentrations in 2023. The top three CTE concentrations completed include Arts, Audio/Video Technology, & Communications; Health Science; and Agricultural, Food, & Natural Resources

• Swain County has met the goal for Pre-K enrollment. (Goal: 75%). 2023 • 27% of 3-8 graders are earning college-and-career-ready scores (level 4 or 5) in reading, compared to 30% statewide; 441 more needed to meet

How students in Swain County traditional schools are doing:

• 31% of 3-8 graders are earning college-and-career-ready scores (level 4 or 5) in math, compared to 35% statewide; 415 more needed to meet state goal of 86%, 2023

• 88% of 9th graders graduate within four years, compared to 87% statewide; 11 more needed to meet state goal of 95%. 2023

• 43% of students are chronically absent from school, compared to 27% statewide: 601 less needed to meet state goal of 11%, 2023


