





How students in Tyrrell County traditional schools are doing:

- Tyrrell County has met the goal for Pre-K enrollment. (Goal: 75%). 2023
- ullet 23% of 3-8 graders are earning college-and-career-ready scores (level 4 or 5) in **reading**, compared to **30%** statewide; 124 more needed to meet state goal of **73%.** 2023
- 21% of 3-8 graders are earning college-and-career-ready scores (level 4 or 5) in **math**, compared to **35%** statewide; 127 more needed to meet state goal of **86%**. 2023
- 94% of 9th graders graduate within four years, compared to 87% statewide: 0 more needed to meet state goal of 95%. 2023
- 34% of students are chronically absent from school, compared to 27% statewide; 112 less needed to meet state goal of 11%. 2023



Access to Postsecondary Credits

Students in Tyrrell County completed **215 Career & Technical Education (CTE) credentials (109 (51%) were industry-valued credentials) and 55 concentrations** in 2023. The top three CTE concentrations completed include Manufacturing; Health Science; and Agricultural, Food, & Natural Resources.



Less than 10 high school students took at least one AP test (NA) versus 8% in peer counties (2023).



37 high school students participated in **Career & College Promise programs (74%)** versus **51%** in peer counties (2023).
