#### NC Pre-K Enrollment

33% of Yancey County eligible 4-year-olds are enrolled in NC Pre-K, below the rural - nonmetro county average of 68%.







- 77% of students who enroll **persist to their second year** versus **78%** in peer counties. 2022
- **59%** of students who enroll **earn a degree or certificate** within 6 years versus **55%** in peer counties. 2022



- 45% of graduates reported intentions to enroll in a postsecondary institution versus 68% in peer counties. 2022
- 45% of graduates enrolled in a postsecondary institution within 12 months versus 52% in peer counties. 2022



**42%** of Yancey County students have **parents with no college degree** (either 2- or 4-year) versus **55%** in peer counties.

#### How students in Yancey County traditional schools are doing:

- 33% of eligible 4-year-olds enrolled in NC Pre-K program, compared to 53% statewide; 44 more needed to meet state goal of 75%. 2023
- 33% of 3-8 graders are earning college-and-career-ready scores (level 4 or 5) in **reading**, compared to 30% statewide; 472 more needed to meet state goal of 73%. 2023
- 41% of 3-8 graders are earning college-and-career-ready scores (level 4 or 5) in **math**, compared to **35%** statewide; 402 more needed to meet state goal of **86%**. 2023
- 85% of 9th graders graduate within four years, compared to 87% statewide; 17 more needed to meet state goal of 95%. 2023
- 28% of students are chronically absent from school, compared to 27% statewide; 350 less needed to meet state goal of 11%. 2023



#### **Access to Postsecondary Credits**

Students in Yancey County completed **1,098 Career & Technical Education (CTE)** credentials (**198 (18%) were industry-valued credentials) and 111 concentrations** in 2023. The top three CTE concentrations completed include Human Services; Architecture and Construction: and Health Science.



75 high school students took at least one AP test (12%) versus 8% in peer counties (2023).



108 high school students participated in Career & College Promise programs (72%) versus 51% in peer counties (2023).
