





• 64% of seniors completed the FAFSA in 2023, compared to 62% statewide; 2,462 more need to complete in 2023 to meet state goal of 80%. 2023

- 83% of graduates reported **intentions to enroll** in a postsecondary institution versus **74%** in the state. 2022
- 58% of graduates enrolled in a postsecondary institution within 12 months versus 58% in the state. 2022

How students in Piedmont Triad traditional schools are currently doing:

To meet state goals, each year Piedmont Triad needs:

- 53% of eligible 4-year-olds enrolled in NC Pre-K program, compared to 53% statewide; 2,014 more needed to meet state goal of 75%. 2023
- 27% of 3-8 graders are earning college-and-career-ready scores (level 4 or 5) in **reading**, compared to **30%** statewide; 46,889 more needed to meet state goal of **73%**. 2023
- 31% of 3-8 graders are earning college-and-career-ready scores (level 4 or 5) in **math**, compared to **35%** statewide; 55,772 more needed to meet state goal of **86%**. 2023
- 88% of 9th graders graduate within four years, compared to 87% statewide; 1,339 more needed to meet state goal of 95%. 2023
- 31% of students are chronically absent from school, compared to 27% statewide; 47,365 less needed to meet state goal of 11%. 2023



Access to Postsecondary Credits

Students in Piedmont Triad completed **53,922 Career & Technical Education (CTE)** credentials (**10,037 (19%)** were industry-valued credentials) and **10,708** concentrations in 2023. The top three CTE concentrations completed include Health Science; Human Services; and Arts, Audio/Video Technology, & Communications.



11,441 high school students took at least one AP test (16%) versus 16% in the state (2023).



4,818 high school students participated in **Career & College Promise programs (29%)** versus **36%** in the state (2023).
