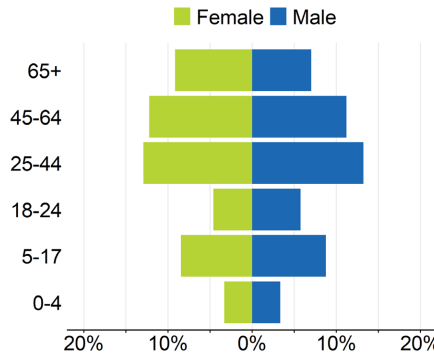

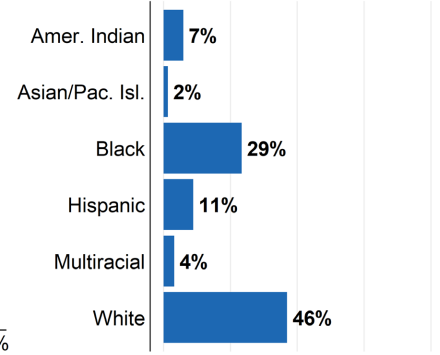

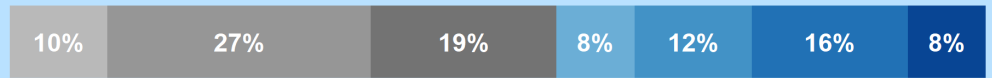

- **51%** of students who enroll **earn a degree or certificate** within 6 years versus **59%** for the state. 2022

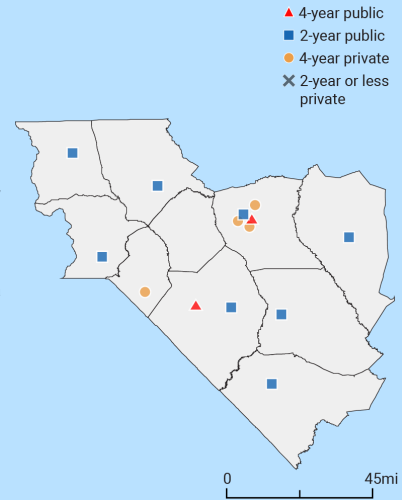

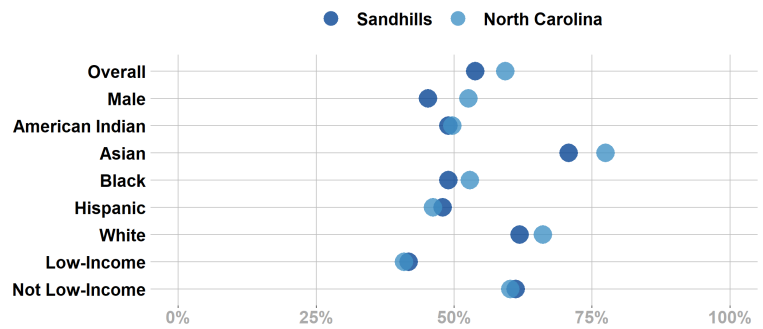

- **63%** of seniors **completed the FAFSA** in 2023, compared to **62%** statewide; 1,365 more need to complete in 2023 to meet state goal of **80%**. 2023
- **75%** of graduates reported **intentions to enroll** in a postsecondary institution versus **74%** in the state. 2022
- **52%** of graduates **enrolled in a postsecondary institution** within 12 months versus **58%** in the state. 2022

How students in Sandhills traditional schools are currently doing:

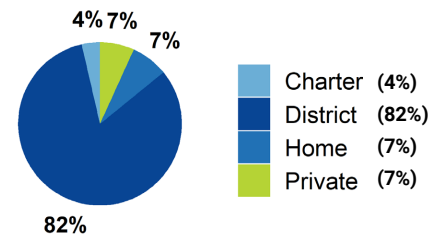
To meet state goals, each year Sandhills needs:

- **56%** of eligible 4-year-olds **enrolled in NC Pre-K program**, compared to **53%** statewide; 1,282 more needed to meet state goal of **75%**. 2023
- **24%** of 3-8 graders are earning college-and-career-ready scores (level 4 or 5) in **reading**, compared to **30%** statewide; 28,448 more needed to meet state goal of **73%**. 2023
- **25%** of 3-8 graders are earning college-and-career-ready scores (level 4 or 5) in **math**, compared to **35%** statewide; 35,386 more needed to meet state goal of **86%**. 2023
- **85%** of 9th graders **graduate within four years**, compared to **87%** statewide; 975 more needed to meet state goal of **95%**. 2023
- **33%** of students are **chronically absent from school**, compared to **27%** statewide; 29,674 less needed to meet state goal of **11%**. 2023
- **2%** of students **drop out of high school** (842 total students), compared to **2%** statewide. 2023

School Choice

154,204 total students were enrolled in K-12 in Sandhills in the 2022-23 school year.

Access to Postsecondary Credits

Students in Sandhills completed **42,382 Career & Technical Education (CTE) credentials (5,832 (14%) were industry-valued credentials)** and **7,062 concentrations** in 2023. The top three CTE concentrations completed include Agricultural, Food, & Natural Resources; Health Science; and Human Services.



2,843 high school students took at least one **AP test (9%)** versus **16%** in the state (2023).



3,773 high school students participated in **Career & College Promise programs (42%)** versus **36%** in the state (2023).
