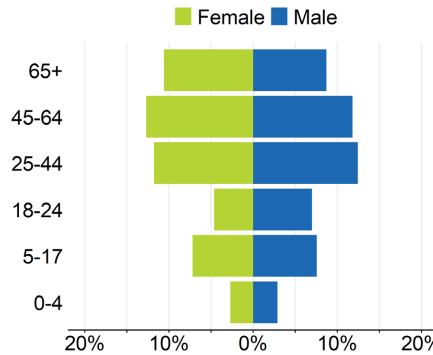

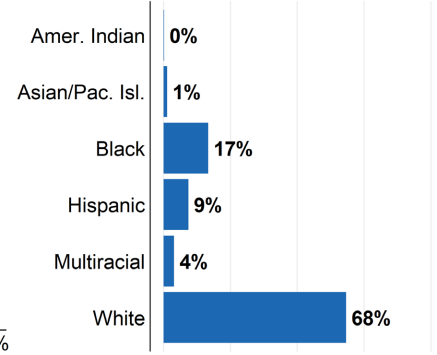

Age Structure, 2022



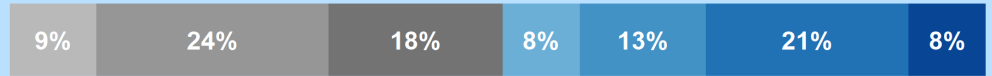
Race/Ethnicity, 2022

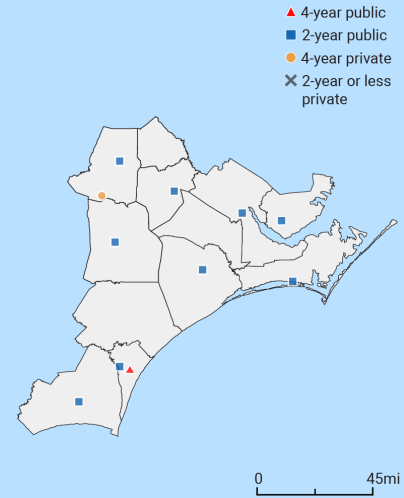

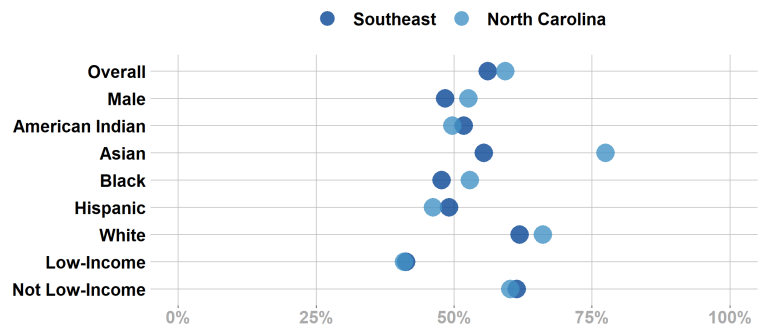

COLLEGE & CAREER ACCESS

- **56%** of seniors **completed the FAFSA** in 2023, compared to **62%** statewide; 2,139 more need to complete in 2023 to meet state goal of **80%**. 2023
- **81%** of graduates reported **intentions to enroll** in a postsecondary institution versus **74%** in the state. 2022
- **54%** of graduates **enrolled in a postsecondary institution** within 12 months versus **58%** in the state. 2022

ACADEMIC READINESS

How students in Southeast traditional schools are currently doing:

To meet state goals, each year Southeast needs:

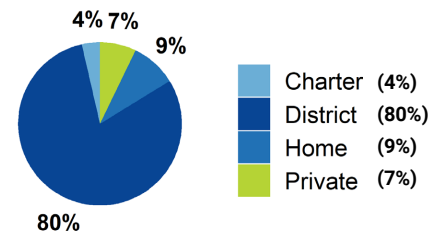
- **54%** of eligible 4-year-olds **enrolled in NC Pre-K program**, compared to **53%** statewide; 1,281 more needed to meet state goal of **75%**. 2023
- **29%** of 3-8 graders are earning college-and-career-ready scores (level 4 or 5) in **reading**, compared to **30%** statewide; 27,646 more needed to meet state goal of **73%**. 2023
- **33%** of 3-8 graders are earning college-and-career-ready scores (level 4 or 5) in **math**, compared to **35%** statewide; 33,197 more needed to meet state goal of **86%**. 2023
- **86%** of 9th graders **graduate within four years**, compared to **87%** statewide; 1,002 more needed to meet state goal of **95%**. 2023
- **28%** of students are **chronically absent from school**, compared to **27%** statewide; 24,418 less needed to meet state goal of **11%**. 2023

2% of students **drop out of high school** (843 total students), compared to **2%** statewide. 2023

School Choice

168,958 total students were enrolled in K-12 in Southeast in the 2022-23 school year.

Access to Postsecondary Credits

Students in Southeast completed **34,717 Career & Technical Education (CTE) credentials (6,306 (18%) were industry-valued credentials) and 6,779 concentrations** in 2023. The top three CTE concentrations completed include Human Services; Health Science; and Agricultural, Food, & Natural Resources.

4,219 high school students took at least one **AP test (10%)** versus **16%** in the state (2023).

4,089 high school students participated in **Career & College Promise programs (42%)** versus **36%** in the state (2023).
